


# CYF Registration for the 2020/2021 school year...

Registration for Catholic Youth Formation has begun! Current CYF families will receive electronic and paper registration forms. New acred Heart families seeking religious formation in the CYF program are asked to stop by the parish office or contact Joan Dold (joand@shemporia.org) or Blake Vajgrt (blakev@shemporia.org) for more information.

The registration packets will contain more information regarding our policies and procedures due to COVID. At this time please note these few items (some items may be subject to change):

- Wednesday classes will begin Sept. 9th and Sunday classes will begin Sept. 13th
- Classes will be in-person with social distancing with students and teachers wearing masks. Class times will be shortened to 45 minutes with the expectation of additional weekly formation at home.
- K-8 Classes will be held on Sundays at 11 am and 6-8 classes will be held on Wednesdays at 7 pm. Additional 7-8 classes may be held on Sunday at 9 am (if warranted).
- Some classes may be capped at a certain capacity. Classes will be filled in a first-come, first-serve manner.

Registration for CYF will close on Sunday, August 16th to allow time to fit classes into appropriate spaces.



This week we celebrate a spiritual master! Not only is St. Ignatius Loyola the founder of the Jesuits, but the legacy of his life of prayer -- now called Ignatian spirituality -- inspired believers the world over. Injured as a young soldier, Ignatius spent his time in recovery reading the lives of the saints. They inspired his soul to holy heroism, changing his life forever. Ignatius gathered a group of friends who also desired to be "contemplatives in action," finding God in all circumstances. This became the Jesuits -- a great missionary and teaching order. Ignatius himself was constantly attuned to his own inner promptings. This self-knowledge -- open to the movements of the Holy Spirit -- led him to be an incredibly astute spiritual director. Isn't it uplifting to gather together again for Mass? I had made a prediction with my inner circle that I thought we would return to Mass the weekend of Pentecost, not with any clairvoyant knowledge from the desk of but with expectant longing and trust in the Holy Spirit. I was glad to be wrong as we returned for Ascension Sunday. Our celebrations together are different yet still transcendent, masks and all.

I'll out myself and bluntly state my opinion...I believe we should only chant at Mass and all learn how to do so. K-Love Masses as they have been called by a pious young man whose family we are close with here in the parish are not to my liking. Aren't you glad that I don't plan the music here at Sacred Heart? I tell you this not to cause division but to illustrate a point.

We are greatly blessed to have Mr. Duryea here with us. His talent, vision, and willingness to teach have truly blessed us. As congregational singing poses a problem in these times, it's been moving to have some song placed before us to receive and to aid in our worship of God. Michael has also been joining the Youth Group on Wednesday evenings as we pray to provide music and aid in our prayer. I hope the high schoolers that have been attending have noticed in themselves the thought, "it is good that we are here."

I had sent Michael a list of songs to consider for our time of prayer and adoration with the high schoolers and was shocked just a few days after I sent him the list that he sang *Every Breath* by Hillsong Worship as a communion reflection piece. I hope as you hear it more that you come to appreciate it even more. It is well performed but also a song with words that should sink into our bones.

Reflecting on Mass later that day, I found it ironic that the one person in the parish who thinks that we should only be doing chant all the time actually suggested a contemporary song that was used in Mass. But that is exactly the point about Mass. It's not about our likings and preferences. We bring them, of course, to the altar to unite them with the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. The Mass and its sacrifice are about something that is greater than us. It takes us outside of ourselves and into the presence of God. We need each other to make us whole. There is a beauty in the body of Christ together.

**Q**: Why do Catholics light candles in church?

A: Candles have been part of the Church's worship from the earliest times. In the days before electricity, candles and oil lamps were the ways that people lighted buildings. Even today, we often still depend on candles during power outages, relying on their flickering flames to bring light into the dark.

Like our ancestors, we also light candles on special occasions. Think about a festive family meal or a romantic dinner for two — there will often be candles on the table, special objects for a special event. We light candles on birthday cakes and carry them in processions. We also place candles at makeshift memorials that appear when there has been an accident or act of violence.

In these moments, their light casts aside a different kind of darkness — the darkness of grief, fear, and death.

The custom of the early Christians lighting candles and lamps at the tombs of the martyrs gave way to the practice of having candles at Mass, honoring the sacredness of the celebration.

As Christians decorated their worship spaces with statues and icons, they would burn candles in front of sacred images and the relics of the saints, basically "shining a light" on what they held to be sacred. When pilgrims would visit these shrines, they would often bring candles to light before the image or relic. These candles came to be a symbol of the person, and their prayer and the burning these candles came to be understood as an extension and continuation of the prayer that was offered. What began as a practical way to provide light has come to be a symbol of the hopes, desires, loves, losses, fears, and faith of everyday Christians offering their prayers to God and his saints. EXPLANATION: A Kansas State Supreme Court ruling cleared a path for nearly unlimited abortion in our state. Bans on taxpayer-funded abortion, parental consent for minors seeking an abortion and virtually all other pro-life laws will almost certainly be rendered unenforceable. In response, the Kansas Catholic Conference supported the Value Them Both state constitutional amendment for life as their top public policy priority.

#### MORE QUESTIONS FOR CANDIDATES

#### Right to Life & Dignity of the Human Person

Do you support bans on physician assisted suicide, human embryo research, commercial surrogacy and similar key offenses to the dignity of the human person?

#### Religious Freedom

Do you support the right of individuals and organizations to serve the public in accord with reasoned conscientious beliefs? Do you support protection of religious freedom? Do you support the Adoption Protection Act of Kansas that allows organizations to place children in foster homes or adoptive families in accordance with their deeply held religious beliefs?

#### Family Life

Do you support empowering parents to choose the best educational setting for their children? Will you oppose policies that force government agencies, businesses, charities, and schools to accept false gender ideologies? Will you support legislation that treats all immigrants, especially families, with dignity and respect?

#### The Community

Do you support access to healthcare that respects human life, human dignity and the deeply held religious beliefs of healthcare providers? Do you support providing social and community services to those in need, including those living with a disability, mental illness, and addictions? Do you support criminal justice reform focusing on restoration, rehabilitation, prevention, and opportunity?

#### The Economy

Do you support justice and charity in legislation regarding wages and economic initiatives? Do you support the right of workers to form associations to collectively represent their interests (i.e., labor unions)? Do you support policies to foster family farms, rural communities, good stewardship of natural resources, and the right of local communities to regulate for the common good?


