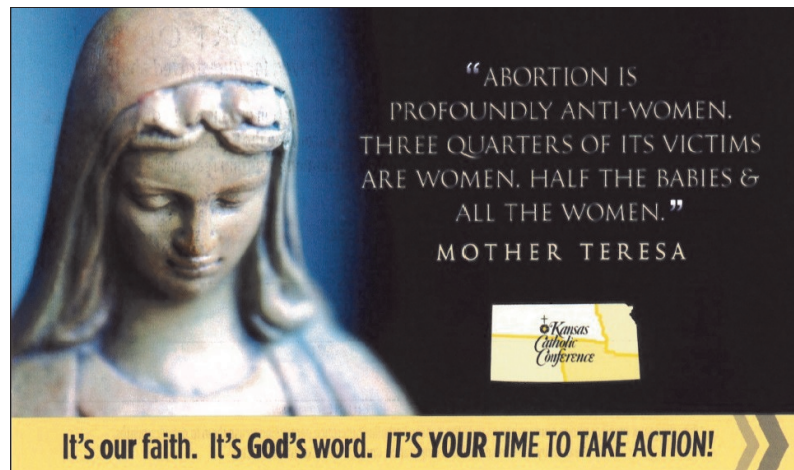

An AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. This device can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. Once you have followed the directions and placed the AED on a person, it will analyze the rhythm of the heart and determine if a shock is necessary or advisable.

According to the American Red Cross, sudden cardiac arrest is among the leading causes of death in the United States. It is estimated that more than 350,000 people will suffer a cardiac arrest each year. Currently, the only way to restore a regular heart rhythm during cardiac arrest is to use an AED. It is still important to call 911 for any emergency, but it is estimated that for each minute defibrillation is delayed, the odds of survival are reduced by approximately 10%, having access to an AED and knowing how to use one, is critical.

The AED is used along with CPR to help with someone's chances of survival after a cardiac arrest.

No certification or training is required to use an AED. However, if anyone is interested in further training or online certifications just go to the American Red Cross website and follow instructions for online / AED training and certification.

**Before Using the AED:** These AED steps should be used when caring for a non-breathing child aged 8 or older who weighs more than 55 pounds or an adult. After checking the scene and ensuring that the person needs help, you should ask a bystander to call 911, then:

1. Turn on the AED and follow the visual and/or audio prompts.
2. Open the person's shirt and wipe his or her bare chest dry. If the person is wearing any medication patches, you should use a gloved (if possible) hand to remove the patches before wiping the person's chest.
3. Attach the AED pads, and plug in the connector (if necessary).
4. Make sure no one, including you, is touching the person. Tell everyone to "stand clear."
5. Push the "analyze" button (if necessary) and allow the AED to analyze the person's heart rhythm.
6. If the AED recommends that you deliver a shock to the person, make sure that no one, including you, is touching the person – and tell everyone to "stand clear." Once clear, press the "shock" button.
7. Begin CPR after delivering the shock. Or, if no shock is advised, begin CPR. Perform 2 minutes (about 5 cycles) of CPR and continue to follow the AED's prompts. If you notice obvious signs of life, discontinue CPR and monitor breathing for any changes in condition.

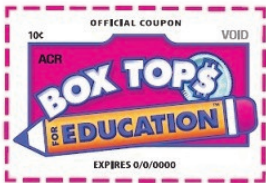

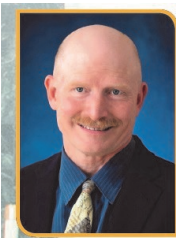
It is hard to believe that we have been in school for over 2 months already. Though, looking back at everything that has been accomplished, it becomes easier. There have been big things, such as another wonderfully successful Mexican Supper. There have been smaller things, like the students raising nearly \$200 for hurricane relief. Yet, what stands out the most to me are the truly transcendent changes that are a little harder for everyone to see. It is this growth where I see God working the most in our school and which give me the most hope for the future of our students and our world.

A couple of weeks ago, I was walking around and chatting with some of the students in extended care and I noticed a Kindergartener with a huge smile on his face as he stared into the hallway. As I approached him, he saw me and excitedly waved me over to him. He pointed at a bulletin board and, almost shouting, said, "Mr. O'Neill, I know what that says now!" So, I asked him to tell me, and as beginning readers often do, he struggled, but was able to say, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart." Imagine the excitement of being able to begin to understand things that you have seen your whole life without knowing what it meant. His excitement to continue to grow was obvious and is the reason we are here.

Every Monday morning, a Knight of Columbus comes to the school and leads us in a rosary. The students all know the prayers and how to follow along with their beads, but the younger ones can have some trouble staying engaged for the whole rosary. Just this last week, I watched in wonder as one of the first graders, who usually has trouble staying with the prayer past the first decade, intently followed along and loudly responded to all of the Hail Mary's and Our Father's. You could see him closing his eyes at times to try and pray harder and catching himself when his mind started to wonder. I asked him about it after, and in his usual corksy manor he tilted his head and said, "I wanted to make sure she heard me today." When I asked who 'she' was, he shook his head and, exasperated, said, "Mary," as if there could possibly be any other answer.

As a Catholic educator, I am blessed to encounter these "Aha" moments all the time. To see a child's mind and heart growing as they develop skills that will help them the rest of their lives. To know that they are developing both mentally and spiritually. Most importantly, though, our children don't know the difference. Which is how it should be, because God does not separate one from the other. He gave us a mind, heart, and soul so that we might love him more fully. It is wonderful indeed to be able to see all of them developing in unison, and it energizes me to continue to grow this wonderful school, so that more children might experience these transcendent changes.

*Dan Vehige, a parishioner of Sacred Heart, is in his final year of formation for the Permanent Diaconate for the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas. He delivered a speech about this process and the discernment that lead him to this vocation on Sunday, August 18. This is the last excerpt of his speech. Please pray for Dan and his family as he completes his final year of formation. #GodWilling he will be ordained to the Permanent Diaconate in June 2020.*

There are 4 dimensions of Formation in this Diaconate program: Human, Spiritual, Intellectual, and Pastoral. The goal of the Human dimension is to develop a human personality that is a bridge and not an obstacle for others to encounter Jesus Christ. The goal of Spiritual Formation is to establish and nourish habits and practices that will set the foundation for a lifetime of ongoing spiritual growth. We have been taught that we need a daily life of prayer and reception of the Sacraments regularly, especially the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Without these, we will be empty. I love the quote about the need of prayer which says: "No prayer, No power. Little prayer, Little power. A lot of prayer, a lot of power!" Never forget this. Even Jesus needed prayer.

From the beginning of the program, we have been assigned to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, especially Morning and Evening Prayers. Also, to read and reflect on the daily readings, especially the Gospel every day. The Intellectual Dimension is designed to communicate a knowledge of the faith and Church tradition, and at the heart of this is Sacred Scripture.

Finally, the Pastoral Dimension which brings all these together into Pastoral practice. Some of these assignments have us visiting the homebound, visiting the local jail, nursing homes and hospitals. Charity is a **big** part of the ministry of a deacon. This brings to mind a quote from St. Teresa of Avila who said "Christ has no body now on earth, but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours, yours are the eyes with which he looks with compassion at the world, yours are the feet with which he is to go about doing good, and yours are the hands with which he is to bless us now". Jesus Christ the Servant is the Icon of Deacons. God has given me the gift to love people in their brokenness because I realize my brokenness and need of Christ myself.

Some of the classes we have had are Catechism of the Catholic Church, Philosophy, Pentateuch, Prophets, Wisdom, Synoptic Gospels, Christology, Sacraments, Christian Moral Life, Catholic Social Thought, St. Paul's writings, Christian Anthropology, Bioethics, and quite a few others. Over the last few years, I have seldom been without a book in my hand or papers to write or a test to take.

There are two types of Deacons: a transitional Deacon like Deacon Travis Mecum who hopes to be ordained to the priesthood and; a permanent Deacon, like I hope to be ordained in 2020. A permanent Deacon is said to have one foot in the lay world and one foot in the clergy. A deacon is totally a volunteer and I am doing this for my love for Christ and His Church. A deacon can assist at Mass, but it is not necessary. A priest is necessary. The deacon has a long history in the Church dating back to the early Church and is mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles; St. Paul's writings and the writings of the early Church Fathers like Ignatius of Antioch. A deacon also is called to preach, teach and do charity.

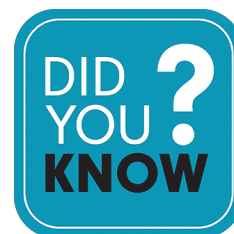
