#### Four Years in Review...

Last weekend was the customary date for priests who are being reassigned to announce to their congregations that news. I was very grateful to have nothing of the sort to share with you! I am blessed with you, with a remarkable staff and with an ideal setup—I thought of this last night when I attended Preschool Graduation in the Parish Hall, a short, 10-foot, rain-protected jaunt from the rectory. I thought of that again this morning, as I walked through the breezeway to the church during Tuesday's monsoon.

Given that I've only been here at Sacred Heart for four years, I wasn't surprised to be staying, as the (ordinary & unwritten) term is six years, renewable for another six (or more). Although, as we know, our parish is part of a larger church, and when needs arise, so too do exceptions to expectations. I also wasn't surprised to be staying because of the work we've done, and are in the midst of doing, with—from my vantage point—a growing sense of momentum.

Just think of the past 48 months... The fundraising portion of our capital campaign had been completed, and a new church HVAC system installed. The north entrance and chapel were close to being finished. In July of 2015 we paused at the Archbishop's request to reconsider our building plans—which was no easy thing for any of us to be asked to do or to complete! Bless you for persevering to the end!

We then replaced the protective coverings for the church's stained glass windows, allowing their brilliance to shine even brighter.

The old Franciscan Friary turned parish office was renovated back into the priests' residence, its historical character restored and its beauty enhanced. The chaplain from the Didde Center moved in, and many, many priests and guests have stayed here since then.

A new parish office was designed and constructed, making the offices handicap- accessible for the first time in our history. The office is so well-made and functional! Rarely a night goes by when some group is not utilizing one of the meeting rooms.

New church statuary were acquired or restored, and votive stands were donated (and are very well used!). The school kitchen and cafeteria was re-floored and repainted and air-conditioned. New signs installed, roofs replaced and parking lot resurfaced.

An additional school teacher was hired. Computer devices for each child were purchased with a grant. Enrollment has increased and reliance on savings has decreased. A school commission has been created, which has dramatically increased parishioner involvement in the school by tapping some of our rich human resources.

Our child care has expanded and is filled to capacity, providing much-needed assistance to parents, good formation to the kids and incentive to enroll at our school.

The investment in our elementary-age children outside of our school and in middle school and high school has qualitatively and quantitatively increased by moving from summer religious education to classes and excursions throughout the academic year. As Abbot James Albers said at Confirmation a couple weeks ago: "That's amazing, not easy and much-needed!" What great staff and catechists we have!

Our adult education and small groups continue to develop. Our music program has expanded to involve many of our young people, developing their talent and sense of responsibility to their parish. Duties for our altar servers have increased and they have risen to the task—I often hear compliments about them from visitors. Our ministers at Mass are so reverent and dedicated. And our Sacred Heart Feast Day celebration has grown into an amazing event for the whole family.

Weekend collections have trended up—thank you for your generosity! And expenses have been pared way down...though those darn insurance and utility costs continue to rise.

Finally, we have reoriented our focus on Discipleship, on being an intentional Disciple, which is so urgently needed in our time, as evidenced by the growing number of programs and initiatives in this country seeking to address such things.

And on the horizon...a new parking lot, working street gates for the school, and a redo of its two west entrances to match the cafeteria and kitchen. More importantly, with the big projects completed, and with my time overseeing Olpe and Hartford coming to an end, we'll begin to develop a network of commissions to address pastoral needs of our parish and of the larger Emporia community—from establishing a pastoral council, to developing a social justice commission to care for the poor and the underprivileged in our area.

Thank you for these fruitful years. I look forward to many more.


