Today's readings are ALL about sacrifice and love. Love and sacrifice. In the first reading, Abraham wanted a son so badly and God gave him one through a wife that was supposed to be unable to get pregnant. God tested Abraham's love for him. Did he love his new son more or did he love God more? Abraham loved God and trusted in him, and Isaac was saved. Abraham sacrifices a ram in thanksgiving to God.

In the Gospel, God transfigures Jesus into dazzling white and says to all, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." God loves *US* so much he sacrifices his own son (the Lamb) for our sins.

How much do we listen to Jesus, as God asked us to? What sacrifices do we make, especially during Lent, in thanksgiving to God for all He gives to us? How much do we trust in God? up this way is the gold at the end of the fisherman's rainbow. I hope you like it as much as I do!

Michael's Spicy Lenten Beer Batter Fish Nuggets

The recipe takes two mixes, a dry mix and a wet mix.

Dry mix:

- 1 cup of flour
- 34 cup of corn meal
- 3 tablespoons Season All seasoning
- 1 teaspoon Slap Ya Mama seasoning
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 3/4 teaspoon black pepper
- Add desired amount of cayenne depending on how adventurous you are feeling

Wet mix (whisked):

- 1 cup of milk
- Three tablespoons beer of your choice. I like using thicker beer like an oatmeal or coconut stout or Guinness. Stouts from Radius are great.
- Cut up any fish you like into bite-sized chunks, I usually use bass or catfish I catch locally, but anything will do.
- Fill a skillet with enough peanut oil for frying at medium heat.
- Dip each chunk of fish in wet mix, dry mix, wet mix, dry mix. I like to double dip because it makes the crust of the nugget a little thicker. To each his own.
- Fry fish on each side in the peanut oil. Be sure not to undercook!
- I like to dip my nuggets! Ketchup, Mae Ploy, Ranch, Blue Cheese whatever floats your boat! Drink a beer with it! Why not? You can also have the nuggets with rice and veggies or mix with a salad. Options! Literally, best Lent EVER.




Track the progress of your Spiritual Adoption!

2 Tbsp. chili powder
1/2 to 1 tsp. salt

Cook beef with onion until no longer pink. Add in chili beans, fire roasted tomatoes, tomato juice and chili powder. Cook for 1/2 hr. on low and then stir. Taste at this time, add salt & more chili powder if desired. Serve w/shredded cheese, your choice of crackers & black and green olives. You can double all ingredients if you are serving a large group.






