

The training makes participants aware of the signs of child abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and five easy steps one can use to prevent abuse.

John presents seven signs to show Jesus' divinity and seven "I AM" sayings in which Jesus declares his divinity and Messiahship. This gospel is full of theological insight and spiritual life providing rich food for meditation and leads readers to the deep waters of the mystery of God.

In honor of our parish feast day, the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (which was celebrated on June 28), TES I decided to re-print a bulletin article I wrote about the placement of our gorgeous Sacred Heart of from the desk of Jesus statue. This bulletin article was originally published in the Memo dated March 03-04, 2018.

Picture it...one priest, one director of evangelization, one administrative assistant, and one first grader...

The day we received word that the Sacred Heart of Jesus statue was in Manhattan to be picked up, we were all pretty excited. We had all seen pictures of the finished statue and were very anxious to see it in person. Blake agreed to drive to Manhattan to pick it up. I was pretty anxious to see it so I sent Fr. Farrar a text message around 6:30 that evening to ask if Blake had made it back to Emporia. I received a reply an hour and a half later saying, "Just arrived. Wanna help? His door is jammed. Out through the window it must go."

What?? Out the window?? I was NOT gonna miss this! So Xavier, my son, and I headed out for the church. When we arrived, Father and Blake were trying to un-jam the SUV's rear door in hopes that the statue wouldn't have to go through the window. No such luck in below freezing weather.

'Out the window it must go' definitely became a reality.

I, as the self proclaimed spectator, had the easy job of holding up the SUV's rear window so it wouldn't cause a hazard. Blake was inside the vehicle pushing the statue out. Father was steadying the statue on the outside as Xavier and I looked on hoping and praying that this whole episode didn't end in disaster. Once the statue was out of the vehicle, the three of us (well, mostly Father and Blake) carried the statue through the north entrance to the sanctuary. Once inside, Father cut away the protective wrapping.

Wow! The statue was absolutely radiant at first sight! Armless, but radiant. Jesus' arms were packaged nicely in a box. Father attached the arms and said, "shall we?" As in, shall we place Him on the pedestal?

My gutt reaction was, you're nuts! I am not going to be witness to this beautiful statue plummeting to the ground and busting into a bajillion pieces! "How do you think we got St. Michael up there?" came the reply. 1, 2, 3 lift! The men lifted, I sorta helped, and Xavier was by the piano wide-eyed and mouth agape! Well, as you can see, catastrophe was averted...thank God! The statue is gorgeous and now you know how it got there!

On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts. Peter & Paul. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas, which means 'Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord. He was the first to recognize that Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the living God," and eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. In his boldness, he also made many mistakes, however, such as losing faith when walking on water with Christ and betraying the Lord on the night of His passion. Yet despite his human weaknesses, Peter was chosen to shepherd God's flock.


St. Peter spent his last years in Rome, leading the Church through persecution and eventually being martyred in the year

64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request. He claimed he was not worthy to die as his Lord. St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul. Saul zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Scripture records that Saul was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen.

Saul's conversion took place as he was on his way to Damascus to persecute the Christian community there. As he was traveling along the road, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light from heaven. He was blinded and fell



off his horse. He then heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He answered: "Who are you, Lord?" Christ said: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting." Saul continued to Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles of the Mediterranean world. Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome and was beheaded in the year 67. He is buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.




