There are 38 days until Christmas Day. It seems to come earlier and earlier each year. By this I mean, it's barely past Halloween and the candy corn is traded for candy canes, Black Friday ads are ramped up, and Christmas carols are playing in the stores. Am I the only one annoyed by this? I have grown weary of the over-commercialization of Christmas.

For many years, I spent the time between Halloween and Christmas Day in a "bah-humbug" state of mind. I had failed to realize that what was really missing was the prayerful expectation of the birth of Christ through observing Advent. As we continue to develop holiday traditions in my family, it has become more and more important to emphasize the importance of Advent. Having a child being formed with a Catholic education has helped me understand and foster a deeper appreciation for the season of Advent. I have come to truly embrace this season as a way to prepare my heart and home for the coming of Christ at Christmas.

As the first teacher of our son's Catholic faith, we have slowly added family traditions that help foster that waiting and expectation of the birth of Jesus. Our Advent Wreath is the focal point of our dining room table. Lighting the candle daily has become something that our son looks forward to. Since our son was a toddler, we've kept an Advent calendar but this year look forward to introducing *The Jesse Tree*. We are eager to step-up our Advent preparation with an activity that uses Bible verses and ornaments to trace salvation history from Creation to the birth of Jesus. We celebrate St. Nicholas Day. After all, Santa Claus is a derivative of this generous saint who gave his family fortune to the poor.

The biggest change we've decided upon this Advent is not putting up our Christmas tree until much closer to Christmas. Through my adult life, the Christmas tree has been up and decorated by December 1 and put away on December 26. In the book, *The Catholic All Year* the author notes how her family does not decorate their Christmas tree until Christmas Eve. She points out the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)* (the book of rules/instructions governing how Mass is to be celebrated) gives an understanding of how the Church experiences the various liturgical seasons. The GIRM tells us in short that inside the church during Advent we are supposed to be holding back on the decorations. In the Catholic Church, Christmas has only begun by December 24! In the secular world, we've been "celebrating" Christmas since Halloween or before and by December 26 the first hint of Valentine's Day can be seen. I have always very much anticipated going to Christmas Mass so I can "feel" like it's finally Christmas. The beautiful trees and lights, the smell of incense, the Nativity and carols all give way to that expectant joy. This year, I look forward to my family celebrating Advent during Advent and Christmas during Christmas.

# World Day of the Poor, November 17

# November 17, 2019 marks the third annual World Day of the Poor.

In this year's World Day of the Poor message, Pope Francis reflects on Psalm 9:19, "The hope of the poor will not perish forever." He considers the suffering of millions of people who experience poverty, noting that they maintain hope in the Lord in a very real way because he assures them of his faithfulness. Pope Francis challenges us to be authentic witnesses of Christian hope and to accompany the poor through a personal and constant commitment over time.

# Let's take the opportunity of World Day of the Poor to help those less fortunate and fill the Salvation Army food pantry shelves!

The food pantry can **ALWAYS** use peanut butter and boxed cereals. They do not need Raman Noodles and canned green beans/corn. They **could use** the following items: boxed meals (Hamburger/Tuna Helper), salad dressings, pancake syrup, jellies (no glass jars, please), boxed crackers (saltines, Ritz), canned fruit, cooking oils, canned vegetables (other than green beans/corn), sugars (white granulated, brown, sugar substitutes).



Catholics often are drawn to saints due to their profession, hobbies, or ethnic background. One's patron saint serves as an example of how to live a life of holiness and service to God. We hold up the saints of the Church in high regard. However, we can sometimes make the mistake of seeing them as the subject of stories in print and not real living people. We can assume that their level of devotion and holiness is unattainable. In fact, we are all called to be saints.

Our world needs more living saints living out their stewardship in a radical manner. Stories are valuable, but when others get to see disciples of Jesus Christ answering their call in person, consider the impact. There is a reason why lay witnessing is so important in cultivating a stewardship culture in a parish community. The people we can see and hear are alive right in


front of us. Some will say that to truly be humble means to act anonymously, but we are not speaking here of actions that call out, "Look at me!" We are talking about acting in a way that people see not you and me, but Jesus instead.

We are to be models and examples to one another. We are to build up one another and make the Body of Christ strong. Don't sit back wishing you had the strength to be a saint. You have already been given the gifts needed to be the saint you are called to be. Maybe people will read about you later, but the Church needs you now! ©LPi






