Preliminary planning is underway for the John & Frances Ice Food Pantry & Soup Kitchen. Sacred Heart will host a weekly food pantry and soup kitchen on Sunday afternoons beginning in early 2020.

"Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you." 725 kilometers. That's the distance on modern roads from Bethlehem to Cairo. Assuming one covered 40km a day on foot — ambitious for two young parents and their infant son — the journey would take well over two weeks. Of course, the Holy Family didn't have modern roads. They would travel through wilderness, fear bandits, run low on water, and cross the vast Sinai Peninsula in a reverse of their forefathers in Exodus. Here, in struggle and sacrifice, are the beginnings of the forging of the Holy Family.

"Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod." Large Jewish communities existed in most major cities of the ancient Mediterranean world, after the collapse of

their kingdoms chronicled in the Old Testament, and Joseph could likely find work as a carpenter. All the same, today's Gospel reminds us that the first formational years of Jesus as a babe-in-arms were spent in a strange land. The members of the Holy Family were foreigners, outsiders, immigrants.

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. God took on our humanity. He is in solidarity with our own trials and difficulties. On the feast of the Holy Family, we honor the special place of the family within society. We are invited, too, to recall those families who share in the struggles of the Holy Family in a particular way. We pray for immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees. We pray for all parents who sacrifice their own well-being and comfort so their children may have a better life. ©LPi


Sacred Heart's Cub Scout Pack 158 is pictured with the hats, gloves, and scarves they donated to Catholic Charities as their December service project.

from the desk of

I enjoy watching our altar servers at Mass. They are so well trained and serve with such piety. It is beautiful to see and should inspire our devotion as well.

When I was about 9 or 10, I was a devoted altar server. I served on Sundays and also had the opportunity to serve at daily Mass on Wednesdays on occasion. I still remember the excitement to be called up as a young server for Easter Sunday only to find that someone else had already filled the vacancy, leaving me with teary eyes through the beginning of Mass at the disappointment of the stolen opportunity.

One of my most prominent memories from serving at Mass comes from an "old Church lady" telling me that if you look hard enough you can see the Holy Spirit actually change the host into Jesus' body. I decided one Wednesday evening Mass to give all my energy into focusing to see this miracle. At the words of consecration, there I was giving full attention to father saying these powerful words. I concentrated so hard that I forgot to do my one job at that moment...ring the consecration bells!

We've probably been at a Mass where the server forgot to ring the bells. The absence of ringing is so noticeable that it doesn't slip anyone's attention, even the hard of hearing "old Church ladies." After Mass, I had a million guestions from everyone as to why I had forgotten to ring the bells. I told them the truth and my efforts to see the miracle of transubstantiation which was met with a smile from every person. It also caused a lot of replies, 'you are going to make a great priest one day' from the old Church ladies.

I love telling this story with our children, teens, and young adults at our parish. It is relatable and comical but also speaks to a deep reality present to us at the Mass. I'm only able to tell it because I had the opportunity to attend daily Mass with my family. At the time, I didn't recognize the blessings that would flow from our Mass attendance.

Often my family would rush into Mass, coming from our various after school activities and practices. Following Mass was always the best part of the evening for my young self...eating out. Growing up we didn't eat out often but when we did it was always after Wednesday night Mass. The weekly routine has obviously been formative in my faith, but I still cherish the lessons and grace I learned from it.

Families of Sacred Heart, it has been my earnest desire to see more families at daily Masses. It may be difficult with your schedules and a challenge at times. I promise you that if you desire to see your child grow up and remain actively Catholic, attending daily Mass together can only help. Make it a treat at first like my parents. The treat will turn into true devotion in time. If you are in the business of raising up saints, I challenge you to carve out a time to attend a daily Mass together on a Tuesday or Wednesday night in this new year. God will meet your family with abundant grace!


