

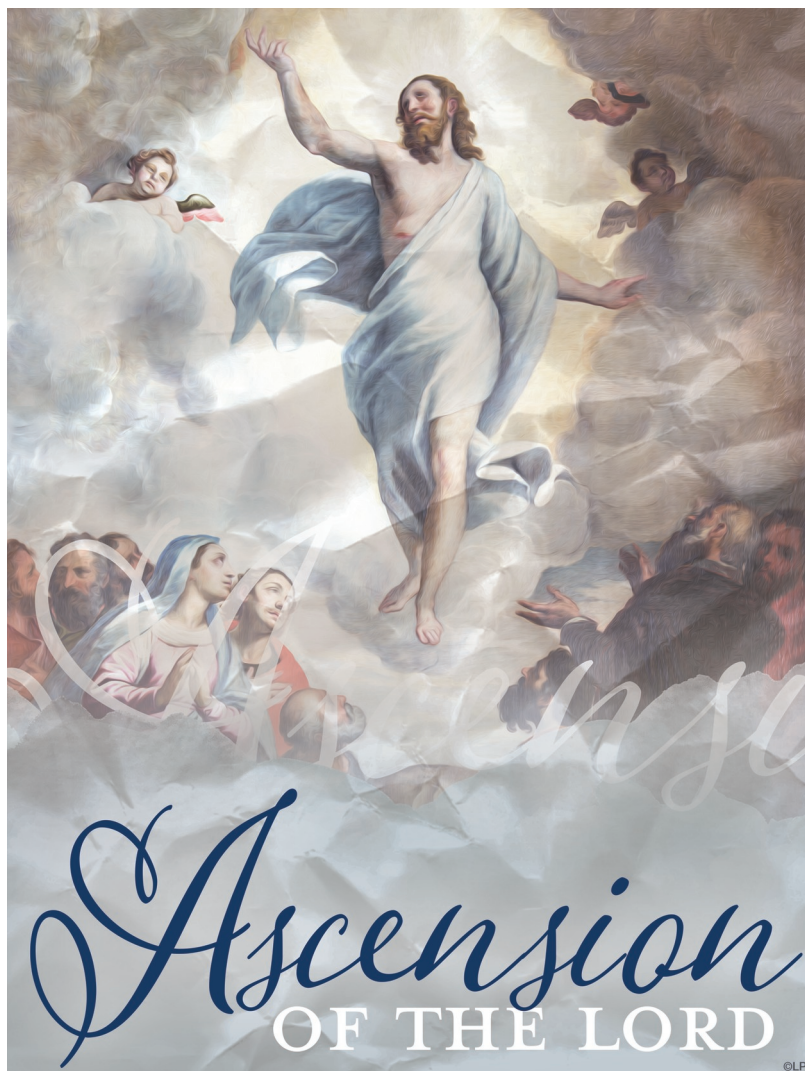

Youth Group:

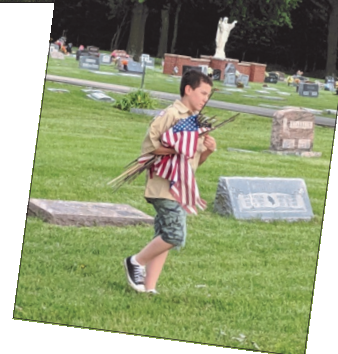
One couch and one love seat OR one sectional couch.

I am the oldest of three and the only one of the three who still practices the Catholic faith. My parents have four grandchildren. My son is their only grandchild baptized Catholic. Try to imagine my parent's joy at having at least one grandchild baptized Catholic, attending Catholic school, and receiving our Lord in the Eucharist and your imagination will fall short.

When my son was very young and in the presence of my mom, she would say, "You're gonna be Grandma's little priest, aren't you?" After hearing this over multiple visits, I found myself feeling irritated. I frankly asked her to stop saying that to him. I didn't want him to grow up thinking the only way he could ever please Grandma is by becoming a priest. Admittedly, I also said this out of selfishness since he's my only child...after all, I want to be a grandma someday, too. Well, my mother found a new way to foster the vocation of priesthood in her grandson. She made him an alb for an All Saints Day costume his kindergarten year at SHS. She then took it upon herself to make him chasubles and stoles in every liturgical color. This labor of love has been so fruitful for his spiritual journey. Watching my son dress as a miniature priest playing Mass (complete with a DIY chalice and consecration bells - thank you Grandpa) has opened my eyes and softened my heart to the possibility of a Father Xavier some day. That is, if that's God's plan.

My family and I recently attended the Diaconate Ordination for Travis Mecum and Anthony Mersmann. What a moving experience! Archbishop Naumann's homily was beautiful. The one line that still resonates with me is "your life is no longer your own." These men went on to vow obedience to Archbishop and his successors. They lay prostrate during the chanting of the Litany of Saints. They received the Book of Gospels and were told to "believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach." Wow!! Think about that for a moment... Your life is no longer your own. That's intense!!

I have gained a deeper appreciation and respect for the vocation of priesthood in the last 2 ½ years. Working for the church and having a priest as a boss has been unlike any job I've ever had. And, that's a good thing!! 'Your life is no longer your own' has taken on a new meaning watching Fr. Farrar give up multiple days off for one reason or another, cancel trips to see family, and postpone vacation for those that he humbly and faithfully serves. On occasion, Fr. Nick, Fr. Quentin and other area priests have filled in for Fr. Farrar for one reason or another by offering Mass at Sacred Heart and administering last rites. These holy men and their brother priests sacrifice much for the Catholic faithful.

When I was young, I don't ever recall having a conversation about vocations, let alone religious vocation. It's pretty easy to expose children to the vocation of marriage since most people who have children are married. I for one am grateful for the opportunity to expose my child in a personal way to religious vocations. St. John Vianney, pray for our priests.

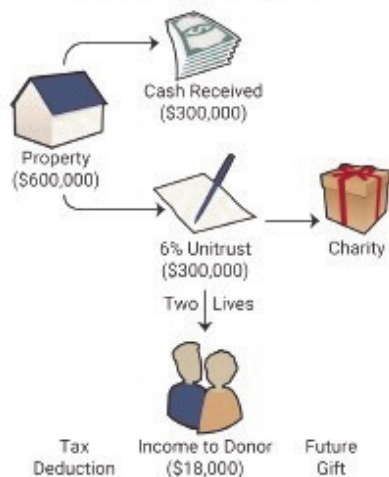


As couples reach retirement age, those that have built their lives around the family farm in America are facing a new dilemma. The farm represents their most significant asset, their residence is on the land, and leasing the farm will only produce 2% to 3% of its present value. A Unitrust may help.

Sell the Land - Pay Zero Tax

Let's assume Bill and Mary own farmland valued at \$600,000. In our example, half of the land is

transferred into a charitable remainder unitrust (CRT) and sold by the trust. There is no capital gains tax, and the couple receives a significant charitable income tax deduction.

The remainder of the land is sold for the fair market value of \$300,000. Thanks to the tax savings generated by the trust, the net result is that the couple owes no tax.

For the remainder of their lives, the trust will pay them \$18,000 a year, an increase over what the land had been generating. Upon their deaths, the value remaining in the CRT results in a gift to charity of more than \$380,000.

The Right to Live in Residence

Let's assume that the fair market value of the homestead is \$150,000. First, they retain their homestead. Next, they deed the homestead to charity while retaining the right to use the homestead for life. The couple will benefit from an immediate charitable income tax deduction of approximately \$37,000.

The Life-Income Trust

Of course, most farms consist of more than the land. In our example, there is another \$200,000 of value in cattle, crops and machinery. The sale of the livestock, crops and machinery would typically produce a substantial ordinary income tax! If, however, they were to transfer these assets into a unitrust, there would be no tax on the sale, thereby leaving the full \$200,000 to be invested.

This trust will generate an additional \$12,000 of income for Bill and Mary in the first year of their retirement. Upon their passing, the remaining value in this trust also passes to charity.

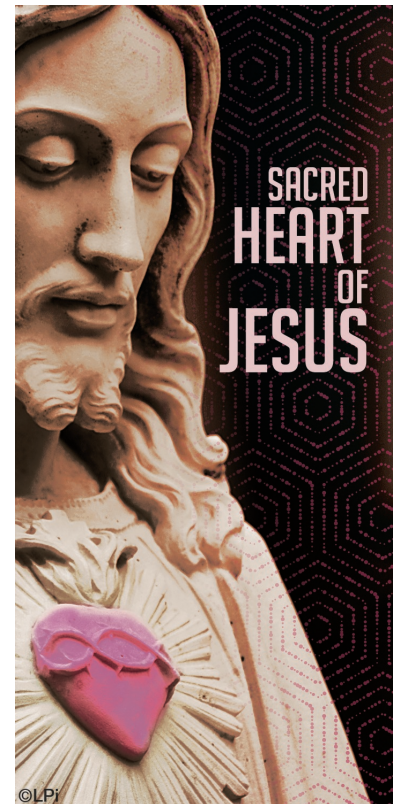

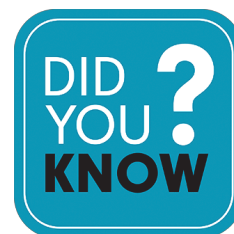
