



As Thanksgiving approaches, it is appropriate to express our thanks to God as the source of all goodness. In fact, it is appropriate at all times! As good stewards, we wish to take advantage of every opportunity to show Him our gratefulness. With the pandemic this year, we have all had to rethink how we do things to stay safe and yet to continue as normally as possible. If you are

looking for ways to thank God as a good steward through these trying times, here are some suggestions.

For those that are able to be back in church, stewardship is similar to pre-pandemic times. Remember that donations of cash that are placed in the baskets cannot be tracked. So if you want your contribution to be connected to you, use your regular envelope or put it in a plain envelope with your full name on the outside and seal it. Loose checks (not in an envelope) placed in the collection basket are checked with our database to apply to the donor's giving record. Using your envelopes, though, is the best way to have your donation applied to your record as they have your name and ID number on it.

If you want to send donations for various weeks for regular stewardship, you do not need to use more than one envelope. Your donation(s) will be recorded as a single donation for the date it is received.

If you are interested in giving to the Assistance Fund to help people who request aid in paying rent, paying utility bills or needing transportation, place your contribution in a plain envelope with "Assistance Fund" and your full name on the outside. Similarly, if you are interested in giving to the Ice Food Pantry/Soup Kitchen, place your donation in an envelope marked "Ice Food Pantry". Remember to include your name to be able to add these donations to your giving record!

If you want to write one check for more than one fund (or envelope), be sure to send a note or clearly mark in the Memo section of the check how it is to be split between funds. That will help the money counters to record the donation as you wish.

For parishioners that are not able to be back in church, donations can be made by using envelopes similar to the above and sending them by mail through the US mail or dropping them in the mail drop which is located directly to your left if you are standing in front of the parish office building front door.

Also available as a means of giving to Sacred Heart is monthly giving through ACH or credit card. By selecting one of these methods, your contribution will be automatically withdrawn from your bank account or with a credit card payment each month. Simply call me at the office to get this set up as you would like.

Lastly, there is the option to give through the website or the kiosk in the back of church. These methods are integrated into our database, so contributions are automatically added to the parishioner's giving record.

I thank God for my parish family at Sacred Heart and as I remember all that God has done for me, I will strive to remember to "thank God" often in word and deed. If you have any questions or would like more information, feel free to contact me.



JOYFUL HOMES AREN'T PERFECT



November: Post election, pre-Thanksgiving, 8 months into pandemic life. Raise your hand if you can use some forgiveness in your life right now! In a fallen world, families can only hope to stay healthy on a steady diet of forgiveness.

As a family, discuss:

- What is our normal pattern as a family when someone gets hurt? Do I like this pattern or not? Why?
- Have you ever met someone who is angry and bitter most of the time? What do you think contributed to this attitude?
- What difference would it make in the world if everyone just forgave one hurt in their lives?
- Who do I need to forgive?

Pick one practice this month!

One small, attainable goal sets us up for success.

- Parents, set an example this month by being proactive about asking and granting forgiveness to other members of the family.
- · Adopt the phrase, "I forgive you."
- Have each member of the family think of someone they need to forgive, and pray each day for the grace to forgive them and wish them well.
- Add one small practice to help your family take the next step in faith:

Attend Confession together

Do a simple examination of conscience each night Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet

IT'S NOT OKAY

"Sorry."

"It's okay."

Have you ever had this little conversation? While it's a good start, it doesn't usually do the trick when a hurt is significant. Why? Because sin is not "okay," including sins committed against us.

Instead, try:

"Please forgive me."

"I forgive you."

In this way, the offending person is acknowledging that their sin needs to be forgiven, not excused. This simple change can make a big difference!

Scripture of the month: Lamentations 3:23 His mercies are new each morning.


