

If you're in 8th grade to high school, don't miss the next Vespers and Virtue Ball this Sunday, March 17. Vespers begins in the church at 6 p.m.




The Solemnity of St. Joseph ~ March 19 On March 19, we celebrate the holiness in the midst of unpredictable fatherhood. We first meet






Q: I was asked at work by a non-Catholic Christian friend, "Why do we do Lent?" I didn't have a good answer...so why do we do Lent?

A: There are actually many answers to this question, but this one sums up the purpose of Lent completely. Jesus fasted. Jesus prayed. Jesus gave alms. Through Baptism we are incorporated into the Life of Christ. The various practices in Lent of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving prompt us to live our relationship with Christ in an even deeper way. The history of Lent brings to the forefront the remembrance of our Baptism which is central to a fruitful Lent.

At Baptism we are grafted into the Paschal Mystery of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. We are blessed to be living in a mostly Christian society, but early on in the Church there were far more unbaptized than baptized people. The unbaptized wishing to come into the Church were instructed in the faith and went through a final time of preparation where their faith and intentions were scrutinized before they were brought into the Faith. This time of preparation was called "The Season of Enlightenment and Purification." This time was only for the catechumen (unbaptized) in the early Church.

The Church saw it fitting that all the faithful needed to be reminded of its incorporation in the Body of Christ through Baptism. Thus the practice, in solidarity with the Catechumens, of a time of repentance was developed for all the faithful before celebrating the Paschal Mystery.

Now why 40 days? 40 is a Biblical number that tells of trial, testing, and preparation. Most notably Lent is 40 days because as we are incorporated into the Paschal Mystery at Baptism. Jesus' mission here on Earth was to save us from our sins. In order to prepare for that mission, he fasted and prayed in the desert for 40 days immediately before he started his public ministry (see Luke 4: 1-13). As we recommit to following Christ, we too are prepared for our mission to be sent out to share the gospel by our 40 day fast during Lent.

Now if you count out the exact days between Ash Wednesday and Easter you aren't going to come out with an exact 40. The 40 days has always been understood to represent the time of preparation. Lent actually runs from Ash Wednesday to the night of the Lord's Supper. Once the Holy Thursday Mass begins we enter into the Triduum.


