

**Thanksgiving** is just around the corner, which also means so too is **Giving Tuesday!** 

For the last two years we've presented special projects or needs around campus for this day.

This year we would like to propose an **audio/video system** for the **parish hall**, which would benefit groups across campus. At funeral luncheons, the deceased's family could easily broadcast pictures to the televisions and play their favorite songs. Promotions and advertisements could be displayed during parish events. Items for our School Auction could be displayed for everyone to easily see. Videos could be broadcast from a phone for youth group gatherings. Visiting speakers would have an easy way to display their presentations. The list goes on and on...

This project includes four 65" televisions to be mounted along the south wall of the parish hall, with a centralized Bose

speaker that would allow for easy access, be it for microphone usage, background music, or audio accompanying the videos or presentations on the TV's. Google Chromecast and Apple TV devices, along with a DVD player, will give users seamless access.

The total costs will be right at \$5,000, but the project can be phased in if we don't meet the full goal.

What is Vespers? Vespers, also called Evening Prayer, is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office. Evening Prayer gives thanks for the day just past and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God (see Psalm 141:1). In the Liturgy of the Hours, the Church fulfills Jesus' command to "pray always" (Luke 18:1; see also 1 Thessalonians 5:17). Through this prayer, the people of God sanctify the day by continual praise of God and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world.

Bishops, priests, deacons, and many men and women in consecrated life pray the Liturgy of the Hours each day. Their work is organized around this prayer, keeping God always at the center of their days. Lay people are encouraged to pray the Liturgy of the Hours as well, especially Morning and Evening Prayer. Many parishes in the United States schedule communal Morning and Evening Prayer on a regular basis.


Hello everyone! First, let me say a big thank you to everyone for singing the new Mother Teresa Mass with such vigor! I am so thankful to be in a parish where people are so open to doing new music like this. We will be switching back to the St. John of the Cross Mass for the season of Advent.

Speaking of Advent, the children have been diligently practicing the music for the Advent program. On Wednesday, December 18 at 6 p.m. the students of the school will present their annual Advent program. Please come and see!

The choirs and the students at the school have been learning the music for Vespers on December 15. It will be a lovely experience - the Archbishop will be here and the music is so beautiful in its simplicity - mark down the date, December 15 at 5 p.m.!

Recently I have been frequently blessed to be able to use music as an opportunity to teach the children about our faith. When learning the Magnificat for Vespers, the Song of Mary, we talked about the first Joyful Mystery of the Rosary - the Annunciation - and how the Angel Gabriel's "announcement" to Mary, which is the same word as "annunciation", has often been viewed as the moment of the Incarnation - I like to call it "the biggest announcement ever." "Hey guess what: God is becoming Man." Saint Athanasius of Alexandria, the great father of the church, wrote a book *On the Incarnation,* stressing the vital importance of the Incarnation for Christians: when God became Man, reuniting us with him who lost our communion with him in the Garden of Eden. St. Mary's choice to say "yes" was a great choice of cooperation with God in bringing this about, and the song that she sings after the angel's departure is rich with the gospel message and the unbounding mercy and charity of God, who stooped to become one of us. "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity." I am so grateful to be able to share my faith with these students. Thanks be to God!

Q: I noticed that just before the faithful says "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof..." the priest breaks off a piece of the celebrant's host and puts it into the Precious Blood chalice before consuming. What is the significance of this?

A: Don't you just love fractions! The fractions I am talking about here are not math equations but the act you just described. The Fraction of the Host during the Communion Rite is a key moment and symbol in understanding our Eucharistic Lord. Here is how our bishops in the United States describe the Fraction Rite,

"In the Fraction Rite, the celebrant breaks the consecrated bread as the people sing the Agnus Dei or "Lamb of God." John the Baptist proclaimed Jesus as "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29). The action of breaking the bread recalls the actions of Jesus at the Last Supper when he broke the bread before giving it to his disciples. One of the earliest names for the Eucharistic celebration is the breaking of the bread (Lk 24:35; Acts 2:42, 46)."

The Fraction Rite gives us a visible sign of the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, namely, of the Body of Jesus Christ, living and glorious (GIRM 83). Fr. Farrar has said before, "if blood is separate from the body, that's a dead person, but Christ is alive. Thus, the whole Christ is present in both the Precious Blood and Sacred Host, which is reflected in the fractioning." During this rite, the priest prays silently, "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it." The work of our salvation was accomplished in the person of Jesus Christ. It was the whole person in human flesh and blood that accomplished the feat of our salvation.

This rite also connects us to Christ himself, when he passed down Sacred Tradition to the Apostles. The Eucharistic Prayer has developed over millennia, but it has always had four distinct parts. "These four elements are: bread and wine are presented; the prayer of blessing and thanksgiving is said over these offerings by the one who presides so that they become Christ's body and blood; the Eucharistic bread is broken; the species are administered to the disciples as Communion. In this way Christ's action on Holy Thursday — taking, giving thanks, breaking and giving to his disciples — is carried on in perpetual remembrance of him" (EWTN).

The Fraction Rite provides for the faithful a reminder that Christ is truly present in the Eucharistic Species. He is present in an awesome unbloody sacrifice, truly and substantially. By signs and symbols, He communicates to us the price he was willing to pay for our salvation. Whole again in the form of bread and wine, He continues to give His whole self to us.


