The first few weeks of the school year are some of my favorites. Obviously, there are the challenges that come with starting a new school year, getting to know the new students and their from the desk of families, unexpected events, and of course this pandemic that won't seem to end. What is so great about the first few weeks, though, is getting to catch up with the students. I love hearing how

their summer went, what they're excited about for the new year, and who their new best friend is. I also love getting to know the kindergarteners!

I thought this would be a good space to share some of the stories that I have heard from the first few weeks. I'll start with the kindergartner who has now told me that I am the best principal, the best PE teacher, the best lunch person, and the best bread giver (Eucharistic minister). Kindergarteners are great at stroking your ego! I had a second grader tell me that they were so excited to come back to school so they could go to recess again, as if there wasn't enough 'recess' over the summer. After our first school mass, a 5th grader came up to me looking very sad. When I asked him why, he said this would be the last year he would be able to go to mass during school and he was going to miss it.

My favorite line though came from a kindergartener. It was the second day of school and he was already worn out. We were at lunch and I was encouraging him to finish up so he could go outside to recess. He instead laid his head on the table and began to cry. When I asked him why he was so sad, he looked me dead in the eye and said, "I don't want to grow up, but my dad told me I have to, but I just want to stay at home and play. School is a lot of work!"

School can be a lot of work. It is important work, though, especially at a Catholic school. The kids are getting back into their routines of math and reading, science and social studies. However, it is the prayer, the adoration, attending mass, and learning about our faith that energizes the soul. The students are all settling back in, and the kindergarten is getting used to their new normal. It is an exciting time of year and I can't wait to see where this year takes us.
