grow in excellence and faith.

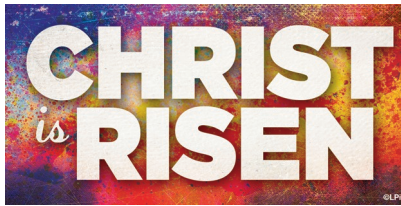
So, thank you to all of you Cheerful

Sacred Heart School celebrates the Easter Octave!



(at left) Sacred Heart students made and enjoyed Resurrection Rolls! A (pure and white) marshmallow representing Jesus is dipped in melted butter, cinnamon, and sugar. This represents the oils and spices that were used to anoint Jesus' body after he was taken off the cross. The marshmallow is then wrapped in a crescent roll, representing Jesus' tomb. The roll is baked and when it comes out of the oven the roll is hollow, representing Jesus' empty tomb and our risen Lord!



(above) SHS students create Resurrection Gardens!

Small flower pots were surrounded with potting soil and sprinkled with grass seed. When watered and nurtured, the garden will spring to new life. Just like we gain new life by nurturing our relationship with Jesus!



(above and left) SHS students go on a Resurrection egg hunt! They were first lead to the soccer field behind the school building to hunt for eggs. Only to discover the field was empty...just like the tomb when Mary Magdalene, Peter and John first arrived. The students later worked together in small teams to locate specific eggs and upon opening their eggs discovered bible verses corresponding to the resurrection story. Some eggs had little trinkets that could be matched to the bible verse, such as spice and rope.

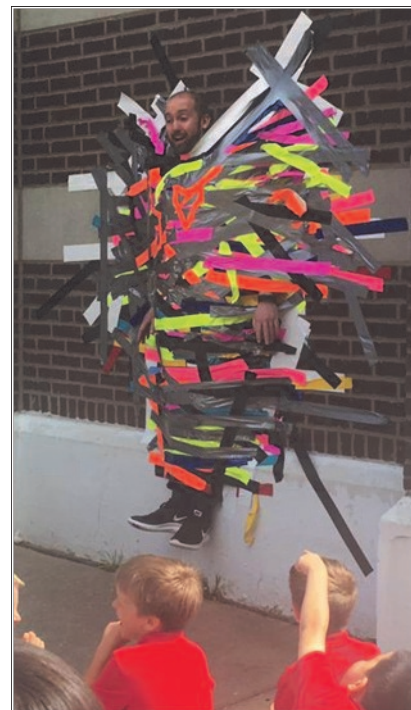
(top of page 5) Mr. O'Neill was the big "winner" in the recent duct tape event! During Lent, students raised roughly \$600 for Heifer International (a charity organization working to end world hunger). During the fundraiser, each teacher and Fr. Farrar had money jars in the school office where students could contribute to Heifer International with the expectation that the teacher - or priest - with the most money in their jar would get duct taped to the wall!

For \$1 per piece of tape, the students taped their principal to the wall. The nearly \$200 raised in the duct tape event benefits Abundant Harvest.

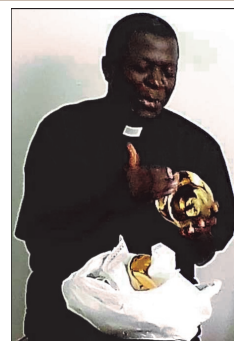
